Hockey Career:

Won four Olympic Gold Medals with the National Women's Hockey Team (NWT) (2002, 2006, 2010, 2014).

2014 Olympic Team Captain. Assistant captain from 2007 to 2013.

Participated in 12 IIHF World Championships; winning 6 gold medals and 6 silver medals from 1999 to 2015 with the NWT.

Third All-Time in Scoring with the NWT.
