Caroline Ouellette is a Proud Olympian and the Owner of the Caroline Ouellette Hockey Camps in Montreal, Quebec City, New Brunswick and Newfoundland. She is the Founder of the Girls Hockey Celebration, a Not for profit organization that welcomes over 1000 young female hockey players annually. She is the Assistant coach in the National Women's team program and University Concordia and Proud mom of her young daughter Liv.

Caroline was a Member of the National Women's Hockey team for 16 years, and a four-time Olympic Gold Medalist. 2014 Olympic team captain. She participated in 12 IIHF World Championship as an athlete and two as a coach. She also won 4 Clarkson Cups with Les Canadiennes de Montréal in the Canadian Women's Hockey League where she is the all-time leading scorer.

Her noteworthy engagements include:

- Recipient of the YWCA Women of Distinction award in 2014 in the sport and play field.
- 2013 Recipient of *Isobel Gathorne-Hardy Award*. Given to a player that has made a significant contribution to female hockey and that demonstrates strong community involvement and dedication.
- Part of the largest expedition to ski to North Pole in support of True Patriot Love Foundation in 2014.
- Right to Play Athlete Ambassador. Visited a Right to Play program in Benin, Africa.

Caroline is passionate about her story and hopes the audience can make parallels between what is experienced in the sporting world and the every day challenges they face in their field of work.
